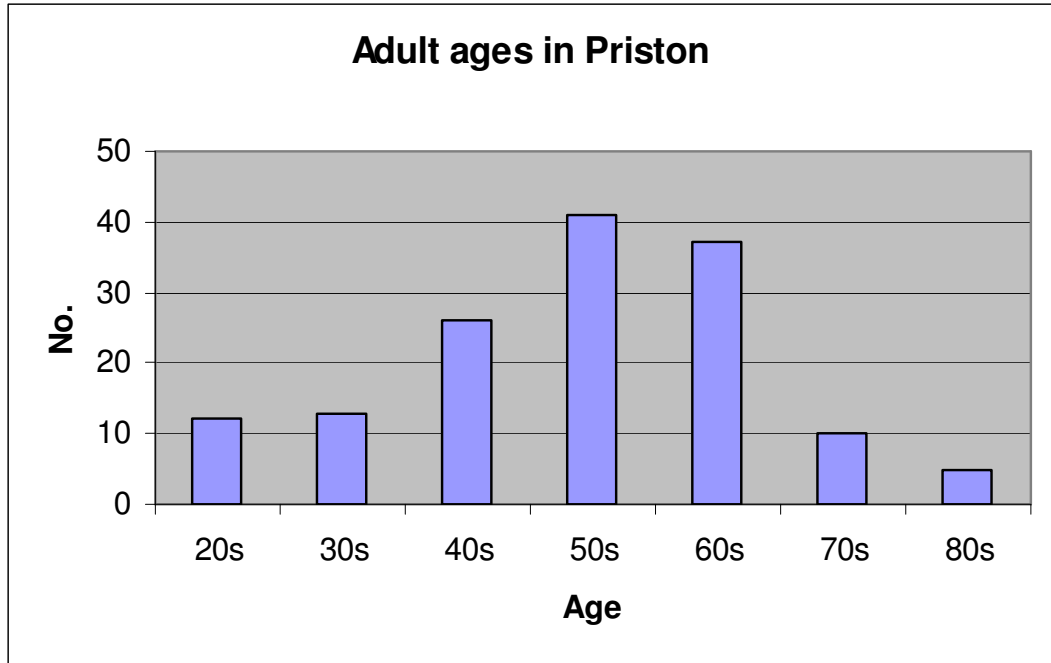
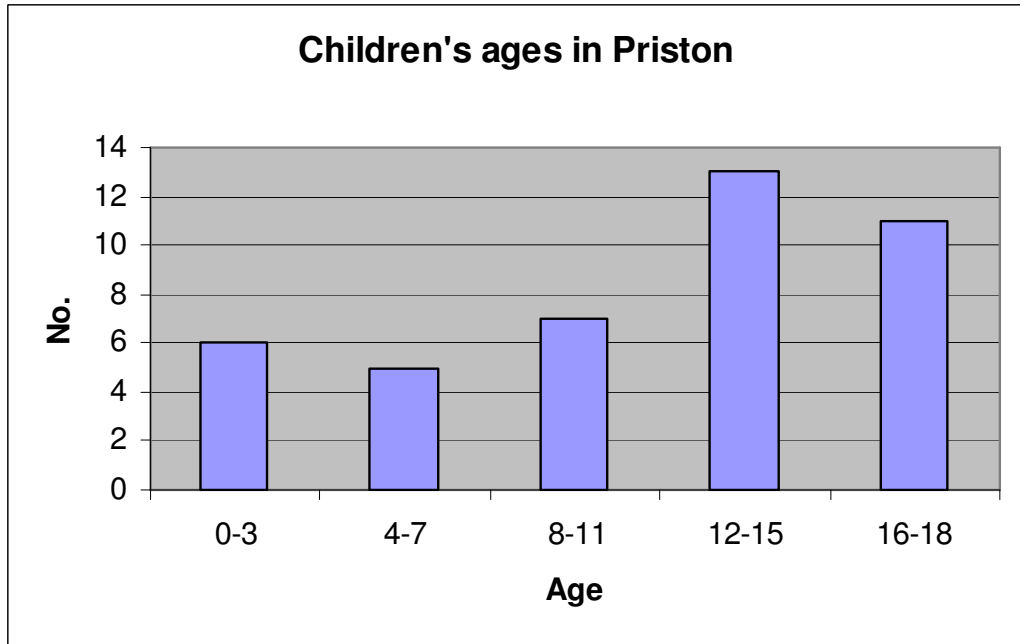

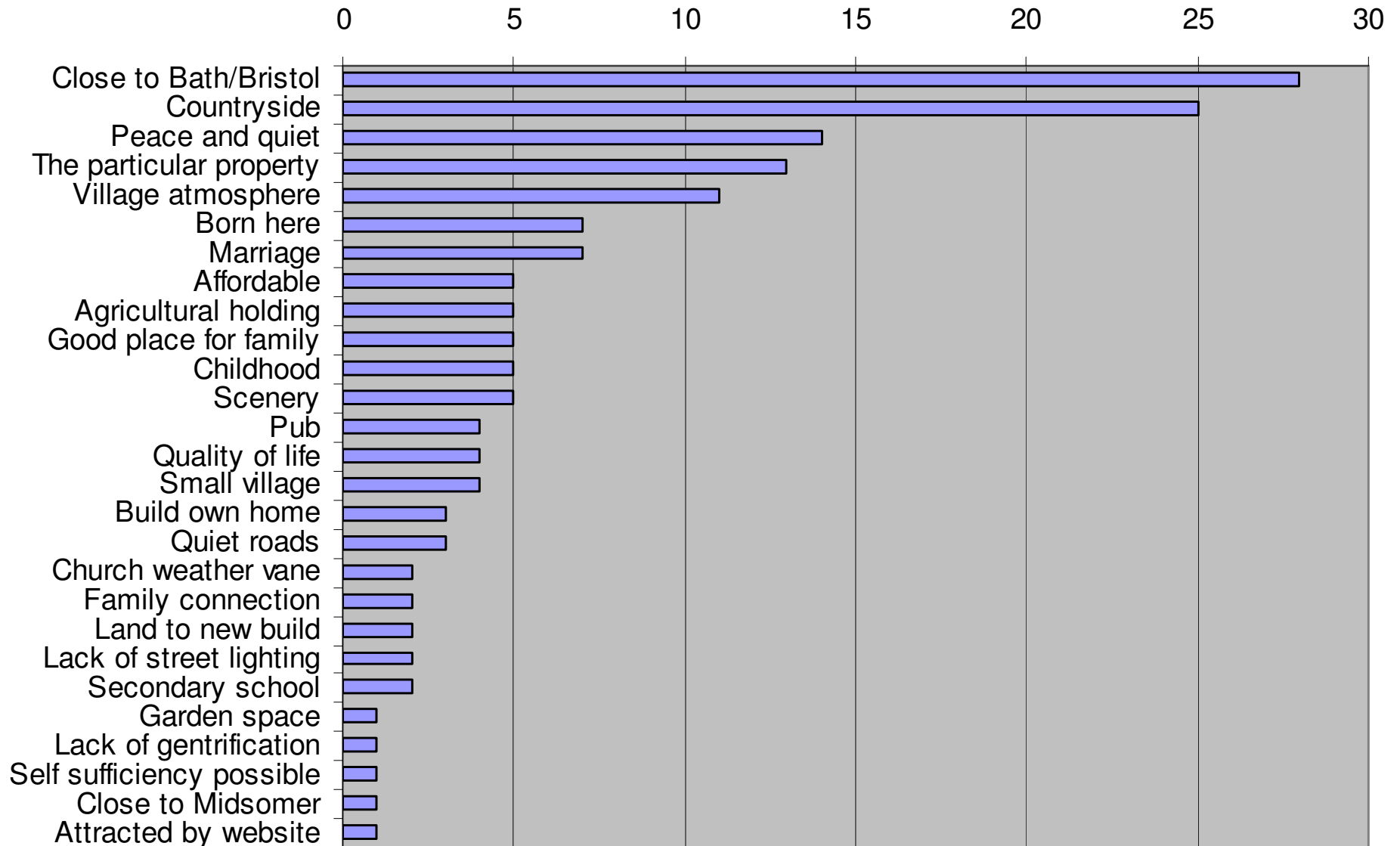

# Survey results

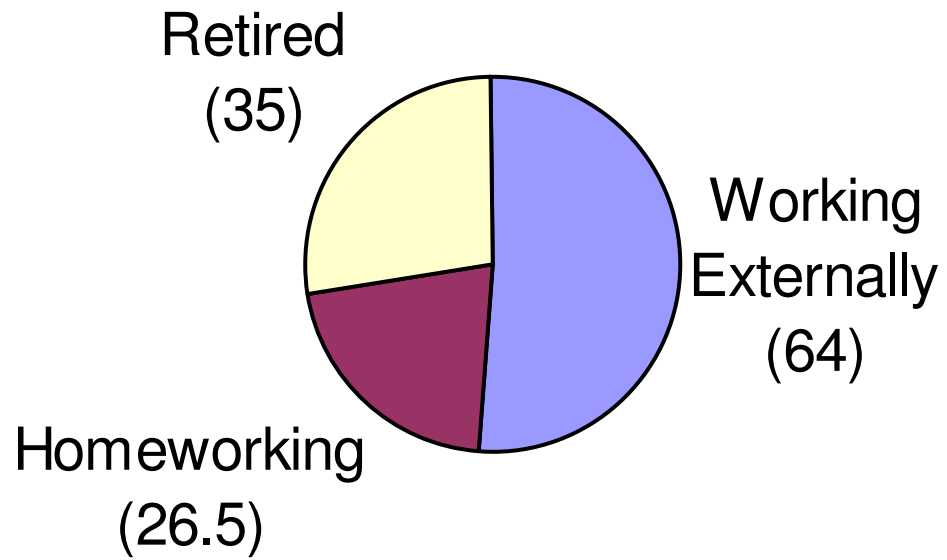
- 74 returns out of 97 households = 76%

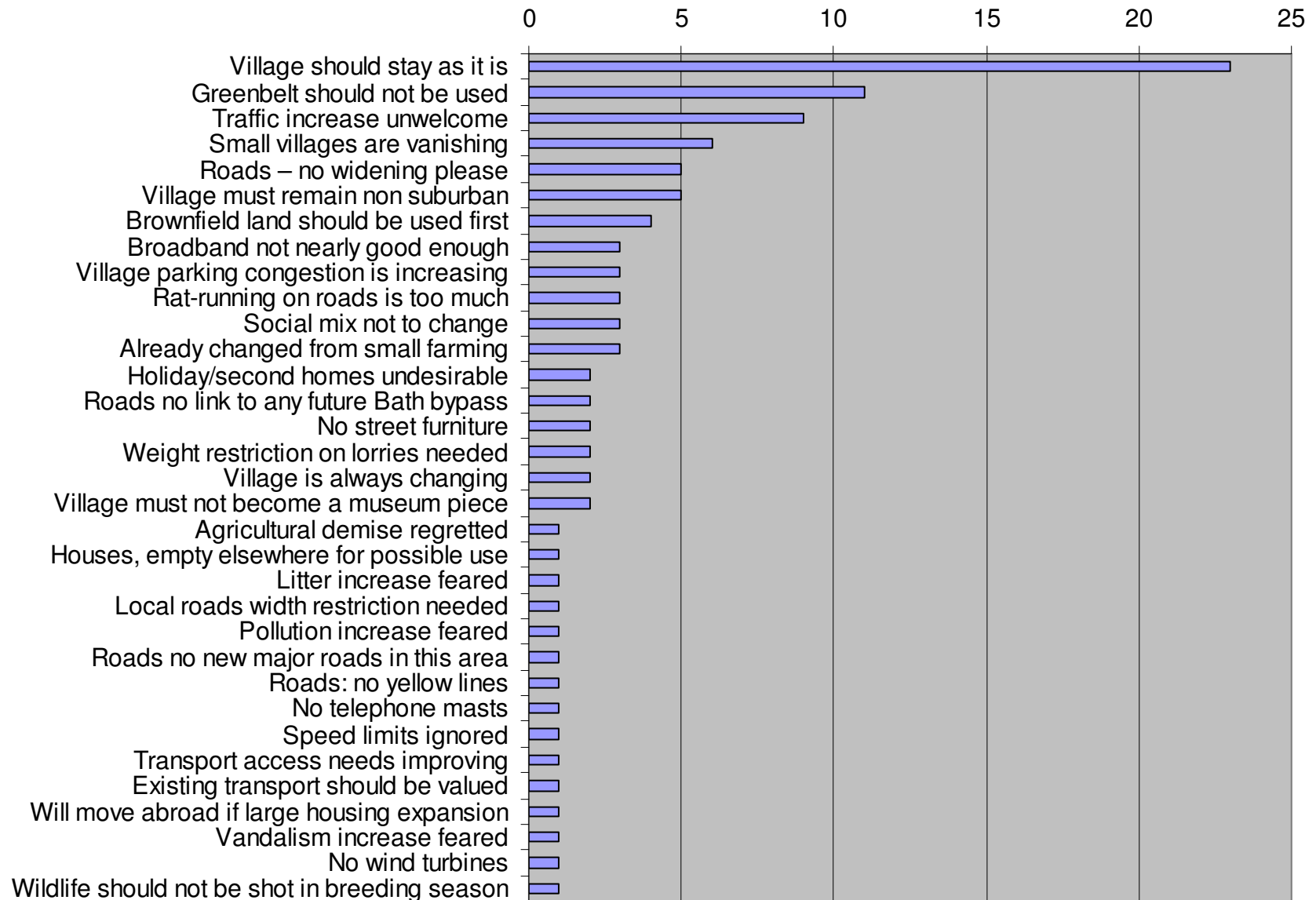
